No charge for a 15 minute Skype Meet the Author visit, as long as your class has read my book before the visit

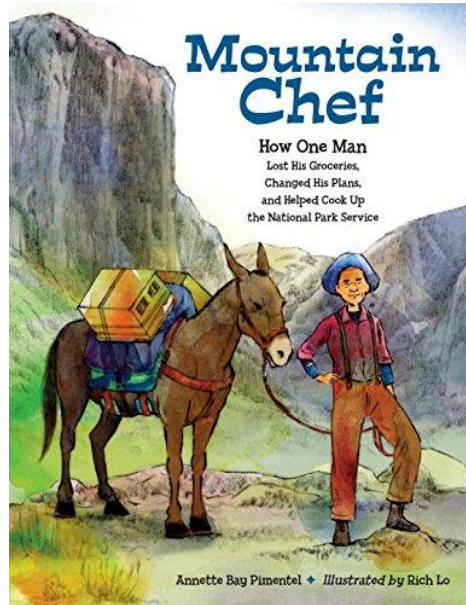
\$75 for one 45 minute Skype session

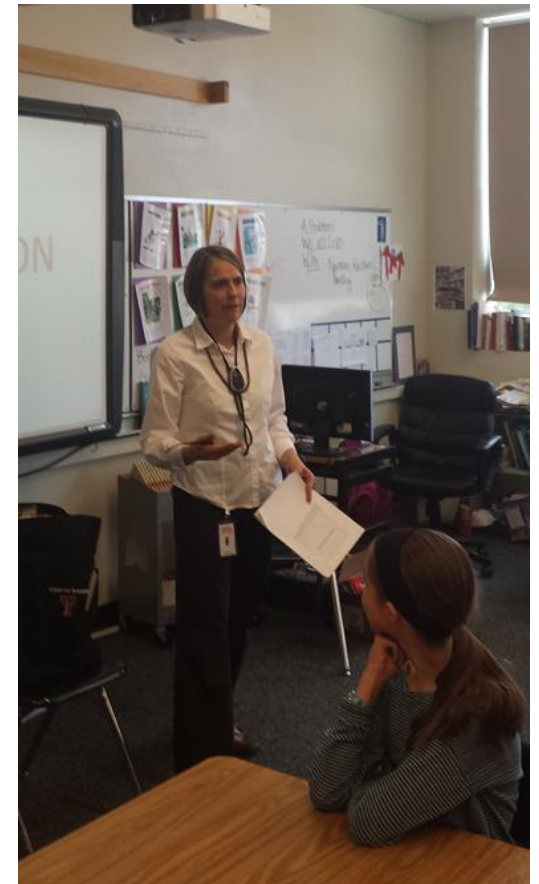

Digging into Primary Sources

Grades 3-8. In this workshop I tell about the trail I followed to find primary sources in researching *Mountain Chef*. I teach the students the Library of Congress method of primary source analysis, and then we break into small groups and analyze actual primary sources. (45-60 minutes; suitable for a single class or a group of up to 30 students)

Getting it Right: Revising Your Writing and Your Life

PreK-8. Together, we revise a nursery rhyme into something even better, learning at the same time the steps of revision. I show how I revised *Mountain Chef* and tell its publication story. We read about Tie Sing and talk about how he used principles of revision to shape his life. I end on an upbeat note, talking about how kids can use principles of revision to shape their own lives. (45 minutes; suitable for groups of up to 100 students)

A Writer's Life

PreK-8. What does a writer do? Where do ideas come from? How is a book made? This presentation follows the process of writing from idea, through drafts and revision, and then through the publication process. I talk about how my community of fellow writers helps me. I discuss how students can build their own supportive writing communities. (45 minutes; suitable for groups of up to 100 students; also available as a Skype visit)
